You can combine this fare only with other Air Canada fares. Circle-trips are permitted. This rule allows a circle-trip or open-jaw trip, but only 2 stopovers are permitted. In this rule the open-jaw cities are not considered stopover points.

DEPOSITS/ SERVICE CHARGES

No refunds. A service charge of \$100.00 in Canadian dollars is assessed for itinerary changes.

Summary

Every normal, discounted, and excursion fare has a fare rule. The fare rule contains all of the travel conditions and restrictions for a particular fare as identified by the fare basis code. Some fares have more restrictions than others and therefore those rules will be longer. Each fare rule is divided into informational categories or subjects. Each category describes a particular type of restriction or condition of travel including:
